

Design Features








Already, The Canadian Remembrance Torch has engaged thousands of Canadians.





In Sept. 2022, The Canadian Remembrance Torch was lit on Parliament Hill in Ottawa with the assistance of the Dutch Embassy, Veterans' Affairs, and a Second World War Veteran.

The flame was then flown on Air Canada to the Netherlands.





June 2024: D-Day's 80th Anniversary, Normandy

Then, in June, its flame will fly to Normandy for ceremonies in France.
