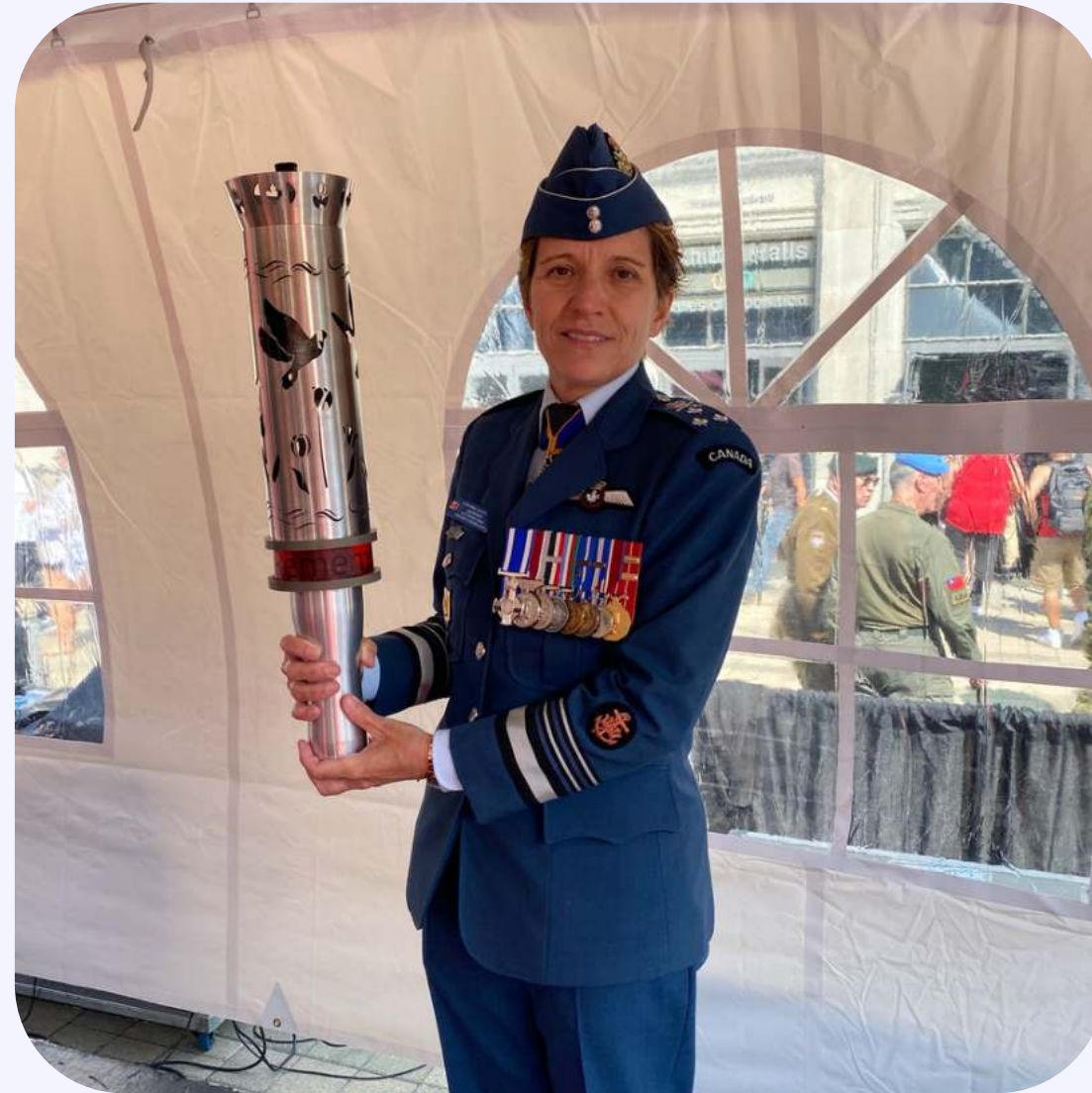

Our Founder and Executive Director is the daughter of a Second World War Veteran.

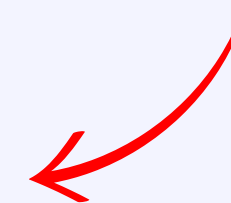
Her grandfather served in the First World War.
